Their son Eric lives in Central City and has provided valuable help with our sound system. Their son Brian graduated from Nebraska Christian in 1990 and now lives with his family in the DC area.

The 32piece orchestra was comprised of musicians from Hastings College, UNK, Hastings Symphony, Grand Island Senior High and other area musicians. Featured soloists and groups were Marilla Flynn ('CS '17), Kaity Flynn ('06), Megan Knapp, Hannah Benson, Grand Island Free Church Quartet and the NC Quartet.

A special part of this year's program was the performance of a piece composed and accompanied by Ron Dukenski of Connecticut entitled "Love Came Down at Christmas." John Rutter's "Gloria" and "For Unto Us a Child is Born" from Handel's Messiah were two of the more difficult pieces that the students were able to perform. The audience joined the choirs on the familiar carols and a candlelight service concluded the evening.

Two Qualify for State Wrestling; Elge Wins Title

Senior Nathan Ritta and junior Isaac Elge represented Nebraska Christian at the State Wrestling Meet in Omaha Feb. 17-19. Ritta, who wrestles at 145, and Elge, who wrestles at 125, both placed second in district competition, earning spots in the state meet.


Elge became the second wrestler in NC history to win a state title when he pinned Daniel Thies from High Plains in the state title match on February 19. Elge, who wrestles at 125 pounds, is a three-year state qualifier. In 2010, he placed 5th in the 119 pound weight class. Elge, who went 34-7 on the year, faced his toughest match of the tournament in the semi-finals, when he wrestled #1 ranked Carter Tegeler of Elkhorn Valley. Elge pinned Tegler in 1:58.

For Head Coach Terry Elge,

Isaac's win is especially sweet. "Words can't even describe how special this is," Coach Elge, who is Isaac's father, said. "Isaac has worked so hard, and we've been praying for his health, safety, and strength. We know that his victory has come from the Lord!"

Coach Elge is quick to give credit to the other wrestlers on the team, as well, citing their team verse, Proverbs 27:17 – As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another. "The guys on the team all push each other, and they've really bonded as a team. Nate [Ritta] and Isaac were great wrestling partners in practice, and they really challenged each other," he said. Ritta, a senior, was the only other Eagle wrestler to qualify for the state tournament. He went 1-2 at the tournament, ending the season with a 35-8 record.
